## LIVEGIRL LEAGUE UPDATE

Our League's Signature Project, LiveGirl League, is now in its second year, and continues to gather steam! LiveGirl League, a partnership between JLSN and New Canaan based non-profit LiveGirl, Inc., has created a unique community that empowers girls in Fairfield County. Since our pilot year in 2019, LiveGirl League has graduated nearly 50 local female high school students from diverse backgrounds representing 13 different area schools. During LiveGirl League, JLSN members serve as Confidence Coaches, leading the students through the eight-week curriculum and creating a safe space for each of the students to develop and execute their own community impact project. Serving as Confidence Coaches has been a truly rewarding experience for our members as evidenced by their quotes below.

*"It was remarkable to watch the participants of the Live Girl League develop and execute their community projects. Watching as the girls came out of their shells and into their own, not only as individuals but as leaders in the community, has been extremely rewarding. As a Confidence Coach, we hold a unique position in helping the girls find their passion, while helping them hone their skills to be effective leaders. Not only am I excited to see another group of girls go through the program, but I am also excited to be able to connect with fellow JLSN members!"*

Dear JLSN Members & Friends,

First, I want to thank everyone for their continuing support throughout the last year. The pandemic took us by surprise and changed business as usual for our League, our community, and the projects we support throughout Fairfield County. Although we are now primarily connecting both internally and externally via virtual means, our impact in the community

has remained resolute.

LiveGirl League continues to thrive through virtual connection, we collected hundreds of pounds of food for our local food bank, we continued to support community organizations through a virtual resume workshop and most needed item clothing drive and we created a "Spreading Positivity In Our Community" community support campaign. We also pivoted our fundraising efforts to virtual by hosting our postponed Spring Spirits event, Puttin' On the Ritz in October, a virtual holiday movie night virtually and now a virtual 5k event that anyone can participate in from anywhere in the world! We continued to evaluate the needs in our own League community and reauthorized our JLSN Emergency Fund which helps to aid organizations and/or individuals who have been directly and negatively impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

I would be remiss to not address our commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion within our League. Our Crisis Management Team, which began meeting as the pandemic unfolded across the nation in March, brainstormed activities to hone in on how JLSN can improve its inclusiveness. We are at the beginning of this journey, but some of our members have participated in the Association of Junior Leagues International, 21-Day Racial Equity Challenge, our LiveGirl League program held once a week meetings focused on Racial Justice Advocacy and we are actively looking for further ways and activities to include diversity, equity and inclusion education and directives in our League's functions and processes.

Once again, thank you for your continued dedication and support of JLSN during these challenging times. We are in this together! If you are able, please consider making a donation to our Annual Appeal as we continue to support developing the potential of all women and girls throughout Fairfield County.

## DONE IN A DAY DETAILS

While we had to rethink our typical Done-In-A-Day (DIAD) events in light of the pandemic, we still made sure to get out there and positively impact our community! We partnered with the Women's Mentoring Network to host four virtual Career Clinics to support women entering/reentering the workforce. We switched up our typical food drive collection process to be a door to door activity collecting over 585 pounds of food this year for the Food Bank of Lower Fairfield County. In December, we delivered 23 individual Angel Tree gifts to local families to provide holiday gifts for their children. The DIAD At Home: Spreading Messages of Positivity project this past spring communicated our thanks to area frontline workers including healthcare workers, delivery drivers and essential workers. Our DIAD events may be virtual, but they bring our members together to impact our community.



Constantly adapting to the needs of our community, we'll continue to develop more innovative DIAD activities that harness the collective power of the League in our community in a safe and thoughtful manner. Stay tuned!

Attendees came together virtually for drinks, dancing, and fundraising fun—all in the style of the 1920s—to celebrate and kick off the new League year! The event included themed tasting kits from Michael Joseph's Catering and a signature cocktail by Cylinder Vodka, a costume contest, spectacular auction items for the highest bidders, a wine pull, and entertainment from magician, Ryan Oakes.

Overall, Puttin' On the Ritz raised over \$6,000 for the League! Thank you to everyone who supported this event!

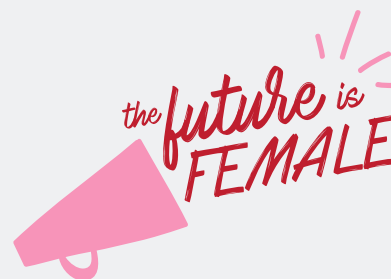

Although LiveGirl League has been operating virtually since March 2020, our students remain dedicated and continue to make an impact. The Spring 2020 session graduated 12 participants who developed projects supporting such topics as racial justice, virtual tutoring and the impact of COVID-19. Our Fall 2020 session had a graduating class of 16 participants, with one of the two groups dedicated entirely to racial justice advocacy. Selected LiveGirl League graduates impressed our membership when they shared their projects during our Puttin' On The Ritz fundraiser! Due to COVID-19, the sessions continue via Zoom with our most recent session launching in February 2021. As our program continues to grow, we're finding new ways to engage our LGL graduates. Stay tuned for additional mentorship opportunities as JLSN continues to support the development of these projects within our local community.

### SPRING 2020

***Don't Run the Risk by Donate a Disc by Jordan Mallis:***

The goal of this project is to collect CDs and DVDs to create an art project and promote recycling.

***Clothing the Homeless by Nicole Dobrucky:***

This project's goal is to raise awareness and collect clothes for Connecticut's homeless population.

***Womental Minds by Abnerline Macenat:***

The goal is to host a mental health awareness program for young people to destigmatize.

***The Fight For Our Lives by Debora Appolon:***

The goal is to host an event to spread awareness about police brutality.

***Ivory Daughters by Leilah Saint Louis & Rebecca Turnier:***

Their goal is to create a mentoring program for young women of color and an event to educate young women on hair products.



LiveGirl League has inspired so many students in our region. We look forward to what the coming year will bring!



***Virtual Tutoring by Emma Gibbens & Delaney Smith:***

The goal is to create a program to increase access to virtual tutoring for those who are low-income or immigrants.

***Music for More by Lillian Gray:***

Lillian aims to create a series of music talent shows and music lessons with the Open Door in Norwalk. She would raise money through benefits to support the program. The ultimate goal is to bring people together through music.

***Stop the Stigma by Olivia West & Kiera Mastey:***

Their initiative is to spread the word about the mental health crisis in New Canaan and stop the stigma around getting help with mental health. They have adapted their project to continue to meet with their fellow students and discuss these issues with clubs at their school who are still meeting on Zoom.

***Mindfulness Links by Charlotte McGeary:***

The goal is to help teens with their cellular device addiction. Her goal is to create a free planner to help youth balance out their time with their phones and other activities.

## LIVEGIRL LEAGUE PROJECTS

### FALL 2020

***You Got a Friend in Meets by Abby Guttman:***

This project creates a safe space for students with and without special needs to connect with each other in an online space.

***Healthcare Initiative by Abnerline Macenat & Maureen Nelson:***

This project will encourage more BIPOC students to pursue careers in medicine by finding mentors and exposing students to other roles in healthcare.

***Cards of Happiness by Allison Milian:***

Elementary school students will create handmade cards for those in nursing homes to help with the negative mental impact of COVID-19.

***Art for Insulin by Ann Macenat:***

The goal is for high school students to sell their art to raise money for those who cannot afford insulin.

***Grief Relief by Breana Chery & Dynasti Jamison:***

This project will provide a safe space for people coping with loss to talk about their grief and to build a support system.

***PWR in Poise by Christina Celan & Maychelle Eitenne:***

PWR in Poise will bring middle school girls together with high school girls who will help them with their confidence. The program will have monthly meetings and there will be an annual Poise Day where girls can come together.



***Community Health Resources by Habigaelle Jean:***

Community Health Resources will create a website that will connect those in the Bridgeport Community to local healthcare resources as well as help residents gain access to free medicine, masks, etc. from local organizations.

***Black Out Stamford by Leilah Saint Louis:***

This organization creates "Black Out Days" where Black people, Brown People, and Allies of BLM will boycott all nonblack owned brands and companies with the goal of demonstrating the buying power of BIPOC.

***The Confidence Project by Linda Peterson:***

The Confidence Project is an afterschool club that helps tween girls express themselves through writing.

***AITE's NOW Chapter Club by Lorrie Solonyinka:***

Lorrie plans to start a NOW club at her school, which will provide the first women and girl oriented club at her school.

***Community Outreach Project for Racial Injustice in Schools by Maggie Murphy:***

Maggie plans to start a club at her school to teach others about racial injustice and encourage them to take action in their school.

***Sound and Sight for All by Nora Amsellem:***

This organization will distribute free glasses and hearing aids to those who cannot afford them.

***This is Not Ideal... by Sofia Degani:***

The goal of this project is to spread body positivity so every girl can feel good about herself

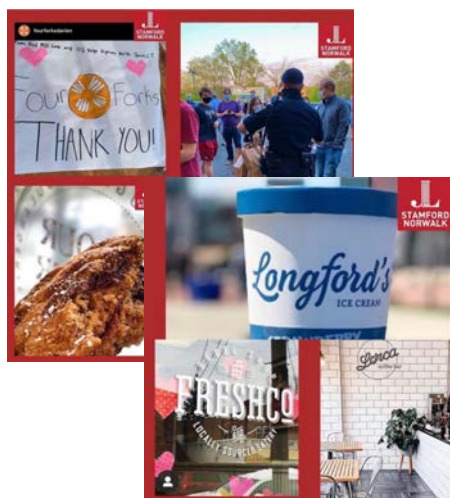
## PROVISIONALS: TWO CLASSES OF NEW FACES

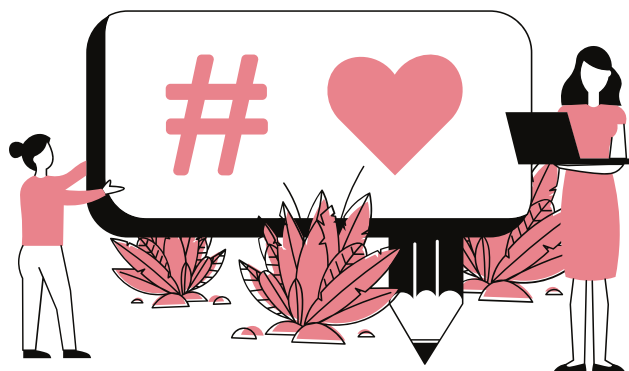

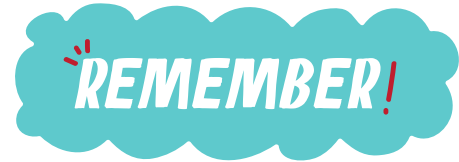

## PRESIDENT'S NOTE ON JLSN'S FINANCIAL VITALITY

Dear JLSN Members and Friends,

2019-2020 was a remarkable year and we hope to return to normalcy to continue our important work as soon as possible!

In the fall, we set in motion our new signature project, LiveGirl League, a confidence-building program providing leadership development and mentoring of high school girls to lead community service projects. This program encourages every young woman to strengthen her community connections, harness the power of her voice and work collaboratively with others to make positive change. We also joined forces with Dress for Success and Women's Mentoring Network to support professional women and their families with a clothing drive and career clinic, served dinners at Inspirica, and collected and wrapped holiday gifts for more than 35 families in need.

To support these initiatives, we raised funds through endeavors such as fall raffle, workout classes treasure box and increased donations through efforts such as our annual appeal. What an amazing impact we are making as we approach our Centennial year with a community focus so closely linked to our mission!

In the last few months of the league year, the global health pandemic, COVID-19, hit the world and came to our shores. JLSN responded immediately by implementing the Crisis Management Team, who met at least weekly to respond to the ever-changing needs and demands of the global pandemic, our organization and community. All programming, including community events, in-person events and fundraisers, shifted to virtual and we never slowed or stopped our support, truly an amazing feat. We enacted the Emergency Fund to respond to urgent needs of the League and its members, such as providing financial support to members negatively impacted through job loss, purchasing PPE for staff and upgrading the air filter at League HQ. The Emergency Fund was also utilized to offset community needs and a number of many other items as CDC guidance changed frequently throughout the year.

While the pandemic challenged us in many ways, I am truly proud of how JLSN forged on through much uncertainty. We welcomed a new member class in the fall, volunteered hundreds of hours in our communities, supported an array of community events, adapted fundraising, held leadership trainings and retreats and had a busy social calendar to engage members, what a year!

As we look ahead to our Centennial in 2023, we are indebted to the generations of incredible women who built our League and we thank you for your inspiring service and continued dedication. Thank you to each of you for making JLSN a true leader in our community.
